We conducted experiments, made crafts, and had various experiences together with the Thai students. And we talked about many things, such as our countries, school life, and girl talk.

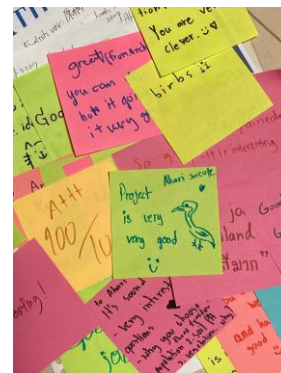


Sometimes we couldn't understand each other because English was our second language, but we kept talking and gradually built a connection beyond borders!

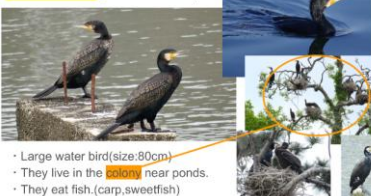
Research
